- Always use Honda All Season Antifreeze/Coolant Type 2. Using a non-Honda coolant can result in corrosion, causing the cooling system to malfunction or fail.
- To avoid burning out the element, do not operate the engine block heater before it is installed in the vehicle or before you add coolant.

3. Route the heater harness connector down below the air cleaner.



4. Remove the front bumper (ten clips and four selftapping screws). Set the bumper on a blanket to prevent damage.



5. Place a clean drain pan under the radiator drain plug, then remove the drain plug from the bottom of the radiator to drain the coolant. Remove the radiator cap to increase the flow.

**NOTICE** Radiator coolant will damage paint. Quickly rinse any spilled coolant from painted surfaces.



6. On the rear of the engine, locate and remove the engine block drain bolt and washer. Coolant remaining in the engine jackets flows out of the bolt hole when the bolt is removed. (Retain the drain bolt in case the engine block heater is removed.)



 Install the new aluminum washer and the engine block heater into the bolt hole using a 24 mm socket and a torque wrench. Torque the engine block heater to 60 N·m (44 lb-ft).



8. Plug the connector of the heater harness into the engine block heater.



9. Secure the heater harness to the intake manifold using one wire tie in the area shown.

10. Route the heater harness along the vehicle harness, and secure it to the vehicle harness with five wire ties.



11. Route the heater harness connector out through the opening under the right headlight, and secure it to the holes in the bumper upper beam and lower cross member with three wire ties.



12. Route the heater harness through the front bumper grille, then reinstall the front bumper.



13. Continue routing the heater harness to the left alongside the front bumper grille, and secure it to the bumper grille with four wire ties in the areas shown.



14. Attach the protective cap to the front bumper grille, and plug the connector of the heater harness into the protective cap.

- 15. Reinstall the resonator removed in step 2.
- 16. Reinstall the radiator drain plug.
- 17. Fill the system with the recommended coolant (Honda All Season Antifreeze/Coolant Type 2). Follow the instructions in the service manual.
- 18. Check the coolant reservoir for correct level and signs of leakage. Repair if necessary.
- 19. Check that the heater harness is routed properly and all connectors are plugged in.
- 20. Put the drain bolt (removed in step 6) in the glove box.
